

Annual General Meeting

16 February 1992

Results of the elections were as follows: president, Paul Goldsmith; secretary, Andrea Richter; treasurer, Liz Ward; OUGU representative/Franks Society, Charles Insley.

The minutes of the previous AGM were read and approved. Each of the officers reported on their activities of the previous year, and the treasurer's accounts were accepted.

Changes to the proposed amendments to the constitution were as follows:

Article 1, paragraph [1], b. ii) was moved to Article 1, paragraph [1], a. iv).

Article IV, paragraph [3], section d) Hustings, was changed to section b), and subsequent paragraphs were adjusted.

Section c) Voting was rewritten as:

c) Voting: Voting will take place by secret ballot in fourth week of Hilary Term on two occasions, the first of which will be immediately following hustings, with the second normally on or before the date of the Annual General Meeting, and at times fixed by the returning officer. The ballot will be supervised by the Returning Officer and/or MCR members he/she appoints. The Returning Officer shall provide the opportunity to vote by proxy for those persons unable to vote in person.

Article IV, paragraph [3], section d) Nominations and Notice: "to all voting members of the MCR" was deleted.

A vote of thanks was extended to the committee on behalf of the MCR.

Luis Montaner requested a report from the SCR as to how many graduate students have applied for grants. Simon Gillon proposed and Liz Ward seconded that the College be requested to provide an explanation of how funds received on behalf of graduate students are spent. The body also discussed holding a forum for the MCR to discuss funding with the SCR, possibly in conjunction with a dessert or drinks night.
